• (2 credits) W (2,1,0,.6)

A continuation of MUS 246: a large ensemble of woodwinds, brass and percussion focusing on works of classical and contemporary literature for wind ensemble. Classical woodwind, brass and percussion majors in the Diploma in Music must take one or both of MUS 241 and 247- assignment and placement by audition.

Prerequisite(s): MUS 240 or MUS 246 or by placement audition with permission of the instructor.
