CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

They will be familiar with thinking in psychological terms and be able to apply those ideas to the self and their social world.

There will be one 2 hour class and one 1 hour class per week in both lecture and seminar style. Students are expected to attend consistently because new material will be presented in class. Students are also expected to take responsibility for their own learning by doing the assigned reading prior to class.
