4. Course Content and Schedule

- -Introduction to drawing exercises e.g. gesture, contour, modeling, perspective, manipulating space, composition, value, colour, figure.
- -Engaging properties of tools: Pencils, conte, ink, paint, pastels, and different paper/surfaces, collage, photograms.
- -Other aspects of art making: scale, content, reference, historical/contemporary examples (includes slides, video, gallery visits)
- -Working with elements of art relating to social awareness/content; comparison of historical/contemporary uses of studio techniques.
- -Keeping a sketchbook which is a record of personal journey, student centred research, exhibition reviews(illustrated): brainstorming ideas, portable studio.

5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

- 70% in class assignments: students are expected to complete all assignments, on time, given by instructor
- 15% students are required to keep a sketchbook for the term, evaluated at mid-term and end of term
- 15% Students are expected to attend all classes, on time, and to participate in class activities and discussions, and attend visiting artist lectures and gallery tours You are evaluated weekly on your participation, innovation, and willingness to experiment and desire to resolve your projects; this includes submitting reviews of art exhibitions and reviews of visiting artists.

Temporary Grade	Description
1	Incomplete: A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
IP	In progress: A temporary grade assigned for courses that, due to design may require a further enrollment in the same course. No more than two IP grades will be assigned for the same course. (For these courses a final grade will be assigned to either the 3 rd course attempt or at the point of course completion.)
