### 2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Use a variety of materials, tools, and processes in the creation of non-traditional and traditional 2D imagery.
- 2. Display the technical knowledge to create photograms, slide projections, cut-out animation, collage and an artist's book.
- 3. Explore through practice and research the ways in which 2D imagery affects and is affected by socioculture contexts.

## 5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

1) Students must complete all in – class assignments by their due date, which then must be kept in a portfolio to be evaluated at mid-term and graded at the end of term. (70%)

- 2) Out of class assignments (e.g. sketchbooks) will be assessed on a regular basis. (15%)
- 3) Attendance and involvement in class discussions and critiques, along with personal involvement (attitude) in all studio (class) and lab work studio cleanliness. (15%)

No text, But students will be requested to purchase tools and some materials valued at between \$50.00 and \$100.00.

\* Attendance is one of the main criteria of the involvement and participation category. It is mandatory because class discussion cannot be recreated and therefore not made up if missed. Missing a class without a valid reason will result in a deduction of 5% from your final grade for each class missed.

Missing more than two classes will seriously jeopardize your successful completion of the course. Tardiness will also have the same effect. Involvement and participation will also be evaluated on the level of care and on the quality of your engagement with your work.
