2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Exhibit skills using a variety of artistic mediums and approaches.
- 2. Use critiquing skills to evaluate their own art production and other students' work.
- 3. Discuss contemporary art practices.

4. Course Content and Schedule

Class Hours: 5pm – 8:50pm Tues

Lab Hours; TBA – a schedule of when Y117 is free for you to do lab work will be posted on the first day of classes.

Assignment/class schedule: There may be some minor alterations to this schedule based on the time related to outcomes of each assignment.

- 1. **Jan. 6** intro to class, video on Contemporary Art issues, **Homework** acquiring needed tools or supplies for course. Drawing assignment for sketchbook studies of historical and contemporary artists, for comparison.
- 2. **Jan. 13** Public Art concept project. Using a photo of an urban site in Victoria, create a public art piece to be placed there. Sample slides of public art. **Home work** visit designated public art sites in Victoria and do drawings in sketchbook of each piece.
- 3. **Jan. 20** Do expanded concept drawings of your public artwork ideas. Work on public art idea by inserting it into photo of site chosen. **Homework**: find 3 examples of very recent contemporary architecture in Victoria and do drawings (in sketchbook) plus three examples from magazines or books (photocopied).
- 4. **Jan. 27** Critique public art project. Slides of the portrayal of the figure in historical paintings. Pick a figure that can be painted in front of a contemporary building. **Homework:** Do thumbnail drawings of at least two of these combinations. Bring prepared canvass to next class.
- 5. **Feb.3** Work on canvass with historic figure/contemporary architecture subject. Video, contemporary art. **Homework:** Gallery visit and review of exhibition TBA
- 6. **Feb. 10** Continue work canvas project. Group discussion of Gallery visit. **Homework**: Collect and draw images of extreme samples of scale from existing photographs and paintings.
- 7. **Feb. 17** Critique canvass paintings. Set up drawing project for composition studies with extreme scale as dominant feature. **Homework:** Do 2 photomontages using found photographs that explore extreme scale compositions. Prepare portfolio for mid-term assessment.
- 8. **Feb**. **24** Critique drawing and montage scale projects. Begin painting (on board) of chosen scale compositions from previous exercise. **Homework:** do sketchbook thumbnails (3) of ideas for final independent project.
- 9. March 3 Finish working on scale painting. Homework: Gallery visit/review that
- 10. **March 10** 3D project with wood and cardboard addressing specific theme(s) given at that time. Discuss gallery visit review. **Homework**: 3 more sketchbook thumbnails of ideas for final project.
- 11. **March 17** Work on 3D project. Video of Contemporary art. Discuss final project ideas to pick best choice for final independent project. **Homework:** prepare for final project by gathering all needed material and tools to work on it next class.
- 12. **March 24** Crit 3D project. Work on Final project in class and as homework assignment
- 13. **March 31 –** Work on final project. **Homework:** complete final project. Prepare portfolio for final assessment.
- 14. **April 6** Critique of final project. Dealing with any portfolio issues. Portfolios must be complete and handed ready for assessment the following week **April 13** for final interviews.

5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

Temporary Grade	Description
1	Incomplete: A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
IP	In progress: A temporary grade assigned for courses that, due to design may require a further enrollment in the same course. No more than two IP grades will be assigned for the same course. (For these courses a final grade will be assigned to either the 3 rd course attempt or at the point of course completion.)
