2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Describe and discuss certain topics in Chinese.
2. Read and write short passages in Chinese.
3. Write about 800 Chinese characters.

4. Course Content and Schedule

Chinese 201 is a sequel to Chinese 200. The objective of the course is to further develop students' communication skills in Mandarin Chinese. We will study one lesson of the textbook every two weeks, finishing Lesson 12 by the end of the semester.

5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)
