  - □ Develop a mature writing process, which may include prewriting, planning, drafting, conferring, revising and editing/proofing.
  - □ Select and use rhetorical patterns purposefully.

  - □ Vary style purposefully through manipulating sentence rhythms, sentence variety, vocabulary and figurative language.
- 2. Read mature expository and persuasive prose by student and professional writers.
  - □ Vary their reading approach for different purposes such as research and criticism.
  - □ Analyze expository prose by identifying controlling ideas, supporting ideas, dominant rhetorical pattern, tone and features of style.
  - □ Summarize expository prose in their own words to reflect coherently the original's ideas, organization, and tone.
- 3. Research topics for expository papers.
  - □ Use a variety of sources, which may include personal knowledge, interview, print, and other media.
  - □ Choose to summarize, paraphrase, or directly quote from sources.
  - $\Box$  Integrate the results of research into expository papers.
  - □ Document sources fully and ethically, according to specified bibliographic conventions.
