2. Intended Learning Outcomes

- identify and describe key art historical eras from prehistory to c. 1750
- identify the leading artists, architects, and patrons
- use vocabulary specific to the discipline
- describe various art making techniques and processes used during this time frame
- describe the various social and cultural factors that influenced the production, consumption, and circulation of cultural objects and how they were used and/or interpreted during their historical moment
- describe the various social & cultural factors that influence the production & use(s) of architectural spaces

3. Materials

a) *optional*: The textbook: *Art History* by Marilyn Stokstad et. al., **revised 3rd edition.** There are new copies available at Camosun Bookstore; the text is on reserve at the library. Previous editions (2nd and 3rd) are acceptable, too.

b) *mandatory*: access to a computer with internet (search for images, video streaming, etc)

4. Course Content and Lecture Schedule

Welcome to the *fascinating* world of art history! This course explores Western (and some non-Western) art and architecture, with an emphasis on Western art. We begin with pre-history and move chronologically to about 1750 CE. Because it is impossible to cover all historical periods, only a select few eras, artists, countries, etc., can be addressed. The artistic legacies we do investigate will be considered in their specific cultural and historic context(s)—that is, the meanings and functions the art and architecture had for their specific society/culture. Art and architecture will also be examined according to styles, techniques, and developments.

Note: this is a university-transfer class (UT class). As such, this class is taught at this level; exams & research papers are marked according to a 100 level UT.

Course requirements: mid term & final exam

Exams are based on a <u>combination</u> of lecture notes *and* material from the Stokstad textbook and any other material. Just reading the text or attending the lectures will not be enough! Also, there is something from every lecture on the exams. You will be given the essay questions before the exam so you can prepare your answers. You are allowed to bring in an answer **outline** (1 sheet of paper, double sided); **not allowed**: fully written out essays.

The format of the exams can include:

- -definitions, diagrams, and/or short answer questions
- -specific questions in relation to slides (slides seen in class and/or unseen)
- -1 essay-length question (answer should be 1500-2000 words)
