## ARTICLE REVIEW:

Review ONE primary research article. Look up articles published in Journals (e.g. Child Development, Developmental Psychology) rather than those Published in books (more difficult to obtain). The review of the article needs to include only a summary of the theory being investigated. It will be written in APA format which includes a title page, a header with page numbers, the body of the paper and a list of references.

### **Research Paper 25%**

Research Paper: You will be asked to conduct a series of observations with an infant or child. Using developmental theories, you will analyze these observations across physical, cognitive and social domains. This will be written up in APA style and will be described in greater detail as the course progresses. This research paper will be worth 25% of your grade

Temporary Grade	Description
