4. Course Content and Schedule

5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

Assignments – In class assignments.. Students are expected to complete all assignments, on time, that are given by the instructor. (70%)

Sketchbook – students are expected to keep a sketchbook for the term,. It will be evaluated at mid-term and end of term. (15%)

Missing classes (without valid reasons) will result in a diminished grade which could result in failing the course if absences are frequent.. This also includes attending visiting artist lectures and visiting galleries as assigned.
