2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will:

- 1) Increase vocabulary (approximately 220 new words).
- 2) Increase their knowledge of Kanji (approximately 60 new Kanji characters) and Master 317 Kanji characters for reading and writing,
- 3) Increase knowledge in grammar for communication with intermediate level complexity Including causative and passive,
- 4) Learn the levels of speech in Japanese (honorific, polite, humble expressions and imperative),
- 5) Be able to read and comprehend various styles of Japanese materials such as biographies, questionnaires, letters, comic monologue, and etc.
- 6) Practice writing in those styles described in 5) with intermediate grammatical complexity.
