- 1. Discuss historical and contemporary examples of printmaking art.
- 2. Apply the elements and processes of formal drawing and printmaking to own work.
- 3. Use printing tools, materials and equipment safely.
- 4. Explore in research and practice new forms and materials in printmaking.

### 3. Required Materials

The Complete Printmaker by Ross/Romano/Ross (text is used in Art 221 also)

- 1. Linocut tool and Extra Blades
- 2. Drypoint tool
- 3. Paint brushes for oil-based paint
- 4. Artist's apron or lab coat
- 5. Exacto Knife with extra blades
- 6. Nitrile or Latex disposable gloves
- 7. Sketchbook
- 8. Drawing kit: pencils, colored pencils, technical pens, conte, erasers etc.
- 9. Portfolio binder, plastic sleeve or 3 ring binder to fit 8.5 x 11 inch papers

### 4. Course Content and Schedule

This course contains several detailed demonstrations, discussions and projects – your attendance and participation is required and appreciated in order to understand the course content and techniques and your development as an artist.

Temporary Grade	Description

# 4 projects

- 1. Linoblock, idea/concept or narrative is around light and dark
  - Materials: Students please purchase linoblock 9" x 12" and a lino cutting tool and extra blades. Paper & Ink are provided (3 week project, with several demos and time for self-directed project hours)
- 2. Monoprint, Students please purchase 3-4 paint brushes for use with oil based paint. Your concept or narrative with sketches in sketchbook. Paper, matrix & ink are provided (this assignment and process is covered in a two demo/class workshop, with homework)
- **3. Drypoint** Students please purchase a Drypoint tool. Project is your concept/ narrative with sketches in sketchbook. Paper, matrix & ink are provided (this assignment and process is covered in a two day demo/class workshop, with homework)
- **4. Screen-print,** (paper stencil) students please purchase exacto knife and extra blades. Paper & ink are provided (4 week project, with several demos in class with group activities and self-directed project hours)
