### 2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify at a beginner's level, the process of playwriting.
- 2. Analyse some sense of how the theatre works and what the playwright's role is in the production of a new play.
- 3. Evaluate the importance of conflict for an effective play.
- 4. Practise dialogue with a fair degree of facility, and with due attention to sub-text.
- 5. Practise and hone skills for playwriting through a comprehensive set of exercises, such as monologues, various short statements about what is happening with the characters.
- 6. Evaluate and produce plots, settings, characters and appropriately nuanced language with effective use of figures of speech.
- 7. Practise effective journal keeping, to understand its importance for the playwright.
- 8. Carry out appropriate research to give plays credibility.
- 9. Identify the various resources available for playwright
