2. Intended Learning Outcomes

(No changes are to be made to these Intended Learning Outcomes as approved by the Education Council of Camosun College.)

At the end of the course, students will demonstrate a basic competency in the Spanish language and general knowledge of Spanish culture by:

1. Understanding, writing, and speaking Spanish, using limited grammatical structures.
2. Using a variety of tenses.
3. Using and acquiring sufficient vocabulary and knowledge of grammar to be able to write, read and comprehend written and spoken Spanish at a basic level.

5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

Your work will be assessed in terms of the following grading breakdown:

1. Mini-pruebas 10%
2. Tarea 15%
3. Composición 10%

6. Entrevista oral 10%
7. Diálogo con una persona de verdad 5%

Mini-quizzes – (10% of final grade)

Six quizzes will be given periodically throughout the semester, but only your best five marks will count toward your final grade. No make-ups.

Tarea – (15% of final grade)

All homework assignments are to be prepared in advance and written out. Daily homework may consist of exercises from the textbook, iLrn, handouts, reading assignments, online videos or films, and comprehension questions. Homework will be handed in (by surprise!) 6 times over the semester, however only 5 homework checks will count toward your final grade for the course. No make-ups. In other words, if you are absent on a day homework is submitted, you will forfeit your homework mark for that day.

Writing – (10% of final grade)

One formal composition will be submitted, consisting of two parts: the *borrador* (draft) and the *versión final*. Your instructor will return the borrador version with ungraded feedback and comments on how you might improve it. You will then incorporate these suggestions into the *versión final* to be re-submitted. Both versions should be typed and double-spaced, with correct written accent marks and word count included. Please keep your rough draft so you can hand it in with the final paper; part of your mark depends on how well you incorporate feedback and correct errors.

Ojo: The writing is expected to be ORIGINAL and completed without online translators or proofreading by anyone else. Work that suggests the use of external help will not be accepted.

At-home reading – (20% of final grade)

Students will choose three short novels in Spanish from the library to read at home and submit a 250-word paper about each novel. The three papers are written completely in Spanish and are comprised of two parts: a summary of the story and an alternate ending to the story. There are novels available for various levels and you are expected to read a book that is slightly above your level. The books can be found in the Reserve section of the library and are available for 72-hour periods. Due dates for these summaries will be determined at a later date.

Written Exams – (30% of final grade)

Students will complete three written exams, all of which will include a listening comprehension component. I have designed the exams to be written in one hour each, however, students will be given two hours in which to complete them.

Illness, accident and family affliction are the only legitimate reasons to miss exams. The instructor reserves the right to require a doctor's note if a student is absent due to illness. Students who are absent the day a test is given are expected to contact the instructor prior to the exam.

Oral interview – (10% of final grade)

Based on a list of questions compiled throughout the semester, students will complete an oral interview during the last two weeks of classes. The interview will consist of answering these predetermined questions asked by your partner for several minutes. You will be graded on your performance alone.

Talking to real people – (5% of final grade)

Students are expected to converse with a native Spanish speaker during the semester and write a short reaction to their experiences in English to be shared with the class on the D2L discussion board. I will post ideas of where and how to find native speakers as well as guidelines for this assignment. Oral expression is essential while learning a foreign language and taking risks like this is essential to making progress!

Temporary Grade	Description
I	<i>Incomplete:</i> A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.

No more than two IP grades will be assigned for the same course. <i>(For these courses a final grade will be assigned to either the 3rd course attempt or at the point of course completion.)</i>
