3. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be certified in the use of Global Positioning Systems, and proficient in orienteering to determine 'position' relative to maps.

4. Required Materials

None. Materials specific to the GPS and orienteering modules will be handed out in class.

5. Course Content and Schedule

- (a) GPS module
 - Two full days on campus, starting May 8, 16 or 18, 2017.
- (b) Orienteering module
 - Lecture: 1-4pm, May 8, 9 or 15, 2017.
 - Field session (off-site): All day, May 16, 18 or 19, 2017

6. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

 - 10% GPS offsets;
 - 10% RISC standard fixes for point features;
 - 15% RISC standard instrument settings; and

 - 40% participation, 60% written assignment.

Temporary Grade	Description
1	Incomplete: A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
