Assignments from (2%X4)

Lessons 9 to 12 of the textbook are covered in this course. There are four assignments in total that are the workbook pages corresponding to the class material. Due dates are indicated in the attached Course Schedule. Each assignment is worth 2% towards the course mark. If an assignment is completed by copying from another student, only 1% will be awarded. Late assignment submissions will result in 0.2% deduction per day.

Quizzes

Each of the four lessons is completed with a written and listening quiz, 6% and 3% toward the course mark respectively.

Lesson Recitation

Students are expected to memorize the model dialogue of the lesson and recite with a partner to the instructor. Each recitation is worth 2.5% towards the course mark.

Individual (or pair) Oral Presentation

Each student will perform a 2-3 minute presentation of a proper topic or present a skit as a pair (4-5 minutes). The procedure will be discussed in class. (10%)

Examinations

The mid-term and final will be given during the regular class hour. See attached schedule for the date.

Attendance

Attendance counts as a participation mark. Missing a class will result in losing 0.2% out of 6%.
