### 4. Course Content and Schedule

Classes comprise lectures and seminar work. Seminar work includes discussions, activities, assignments, and student presentations. <u>DOING THE ASSIGNED READING BEFORE CLASS WILL HELP IN THE</u> <u>UNDERSTANDING OF LECTURES AND DISCUSSIONS</u>. <u>ASSIGNED READING IS PERTINENT TO</u> <u>DOING WELL ON QUIZZES</u>. ### **Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)**

- \*<u>Three exams</u> will comprise multiple choices, true and false, short answer and essay. Exams require you to apply the terms and concepts of the course, not just recognize definitions. The scores on all three quizzes will comprise **54%** of course grade. Each exam is worth **18%**. EXAMS ARE **NOT** ACCUMULATIVE. Please refer to handout distributed in class for details. There will be no make-up opportunities for an exam missed without a medical note.
- <u>Chapter Reviews:</u> will comprise multiple choice and true and false questions on material covered in class and chapter readings. The purpose is to ensure the student remains current with the notes and text readings. The reviews will be in seminar and worth 2% each.
  - <u>Research Topic and Mini Seminar Presentation-Social Issue</u>: in teams of three or four students, a chosen research topic is developed and discussed. Teams form based on interest in the research topics. This assignment is worth 20% including both oral and written for 50 points. <u>A written outline of your responsibilities is due the third</u> week. This outlined is distributed and completed in seminar. A Two mark penalty is applied to a late or no outline submission.

EACH STUDENT IS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT 4 PAGES INCLUDING: a title page with Running head-short title upper case, page number, long title of topic, course name and section, student's name, and date, a referenced ten fact sheet with each fact referenced, a copy of a research article, and a reference page including a minimum of three references per group member. All references are to follow APA 6<sup>th</sup> edition guidelines. Please refer to APA sample provided in class. EACH team member is responsible for submission of these four pages on the presentation day.

Lecture attendance and seminar activities are part of your participation. If you miss a seminar, it is your responsibility to contact other students in order to catch up on any missed material. # **B.** Temporary Grades

Temporary Grade	Description
I	<i>Incomplete</i> : A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
IP	<i>In progress</i> : A temporary grade assigned for courses that are designed to have an anticipated enrollment that extends beyond one term. No more than two IP grades will be assigned for the same course.
CW	<i>Compulsory Withdrawal</i> : A temporary grade assigned by a Dean when an instructor, after documenting the prescriptive strategies applied and consulting with peers, deems that a student is unsafe to self or others and must be removed from the lab, practicum, worksite, or field placement.
