Video Recording: In this video recording, students are required to memorize each sound value of vowels and consonants. Then, students will demonstrate their correct pronunciation of Hangeul vowels & consonants. This video recording will be graded on a scale of 0 to 10 for thoroughness, accuracy and sincere work. Details will be discussed in class.

Role Play: For the two role play assignments, a script will be given to each group and students can modify answers to reflect their own situation. Students are required to memorize and conduct their role play. Criteria for marking this task are available on D2L.

Recording Portfolio: For each lesson, students are required to create their own sentences by describing the images that are provided or use their own images and then make an audio recording of those composed sentences. The sentences must include the grammar and expressions learned in class. Recording Portfolio will be graded in 2 steps. The initial submission will be graded on a scale of 0 to 20 for quality and quantity. Then based on instructor's feedback, students will correct their own errors or improve the quality of the assignment. At the end of the semester, students will resubmit their complete and corrected collection. Corrections will also be graded on a scale of 0 to 20, for a total of 40 points per lesson. Evidence of using any translators will result in a zero on the assignment. Details will be discussed in class.

Written Assignments: The purpose of homework is to reinforce the learning of grammar and vocabulary. There will be online exercises, some parts of the workbook and small composition practices for students to complete. There is no mark for correct answers in each exercise, but rather this assignment will be graded based on your sincere effort and thorough completion (e.g. neat handwriting). If the assignment is copied, it will be recorded as down to zero for those students involved. Hangeul Quiz: The objective of this quiz is to test students' acquisition of the basic Hangeul system (Korean alphabet). This test includes identifying target Hangeul sounds, writing basic sounds from dictation, and writing syllable blocks of Hangeul.

Lesson Quizzes: The goal of these quizzes is to facilitate understanding of Korean language taught through each lesson. Each quiz will include vocabulary and grammar features as well as listening comprehension. Quizzes will be cumulative; each quiz will increase in value by 2%. Quiz #1=8%, #2=10%, #3=12%, #4=14%, #5=16%. No make-up quizzes are permitted unless you document of your absence due to illness or accident, etc.

Class & Lab Attendances and Participations: Students are expected to be in class on time. It is important to attend class regularly and to be prepared for each class while you are learning a new language. Late arrivals, early departures and unofficial absences will result in point deductions. Students are also expected to be attentive and respectful in class, and to participate in class activities sincerely such as practicing a role play or writing a composition, etc. Student participations will be monitored in each

class and distracting or disrespectful behaviors will be noted and will result in point deductions. Student absence won't be deducted from the attendance mark with a proof of doctor's note or accidents, etc.

In-Class Policies

- MAKE-UP for quizzes or role plays only if you provide a document of your illness or accidents, etc.
- LATE ASSIGNMENTS will result in deduction of a 10% per day. Assignments won't be accepted after 10 days from the due date unless a student makes an alternative arrangement with the instructor prior to the due date. After the last day of class, late assignments won't be accepted without prior consent.

B. Temporary Grades

Temporary Grade	Description
I	<i>Incomplete</i> : A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
IP	<i>In progress</i> : A temporary grade assigned for courses that are designed to have an anticipated enrollment that extends beyond one term. No more than two IP grades will be assigned for the same course.
CW	<i>Compulsory Withdrawal</i> : A temporary grade assigned by a Dean when an instructor, after documenting the prescriptive strategies applied and consulting with peers, deems that a student is unsafe to self or others and must be removed from the lab, practicum, worksite, or field placement.
