2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the students will:

1. Master the basic elements of grammar.
2. Increase vocabulary to 100 Kanji and 750 words.
3. Be able to engage in simple conversation.
4. Read and write short sentences.

The completion of this course will be comparable to Level 4 of the Japanese Proficiency Test.

3. Required Materials

- (a) Texts: An Integrated Course in Elementary Japanese, Genki I, The Japan Times, Second Edition
- (b) Other: An Integrated Course in Elementary Japanese, Genki I, Workbook I, The Japan Times, Second Edition

4. Course Content and Schedule

JAPN 101 is designed for students who have completed JAPN 100, or for those with equivalent knowledge. This course will build on what the students have learned and further their skills in writing, reading, speaking and listening. Grammar and vocabulary will be continuously introduced in the context of text dialogues. JAPN 101 will cover Genki I (Lesson 5 to 8).

Chapter Quizzes (Written 8% x4 and Listening 5% x4)

Written and listening quizzes are given for each chapter.

Assignments (2% x4 : see page 4 for due dates and page numbers)

The assignment will be given at the end of a class and the students are expected to complete it by the following class meeting. At the beginning of the class, the instructor will ask students randomly to give an answer. **The students will correct their answers with a different coloured pen.** All of the pages that are completed will be handed in on the due date. Assignments must be completed individually by the student (work that is copied, done by on-line translation program, etc will receive 0%).

A late submission will lose 1% per day.

Recitation (2%x3)

Each student will memorize the model dialogues and recite it in front of the instructor. 3 recitations.

Skit Presentation (6%)

The students will form a group, and create a skit performance. The procedure will be discussed in class.

Oral Interview (7%)

This is a one on one interview with the instructor. The students will be asked about 10 questions, and carry on a short conversation with the instructor on a topic given. The details will be discussed in class.

Big Quiz (Written only 15%)

Big Quiz (covers L5-8; however the focus is on L7 and 8). It is given at the end of the semester.

Attendance (6%)

If a student misses a class (lecture or lab), he/she will lose 1% from the attendance/participation score.

Temporary Grade	Description
I	<i>Incomplete:</i> A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
