Volunteer Experience

Volunteer Experience (minimum of 10 hours)

This experience can be a volunteer position that you currently have or it can be a completely new experience. Volunteer experience within the criminal justice system or social services is preferred but not mandatory. You need to keep a log of the hours that you spend at this volunteer job.

Technical Writing Assignment

As a requirement of Crim 220 each student, will complete a short technical writing assignment that demonstrates technical writing principles, style and format. Due in Dropbox by October 12, 2020

Resumes, Covering Letter and Job Description

Everyone is write a covering letter for a job posting to accompany this exercise in class. Due in Dropbox by November 16, 2020

Three Minute Presentations

As a requirement of Crim 220, each student is required to make a brief up to 3 minute presentation demonstrating dynamic presentation techniques. The subject of these presentations will be on each individual's volunteer experience and will be presented on the last day of class, December 8, 2020.
