#### 2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify key concepts describing interpersonal communication.
- 2. Describe basic principles and theories of communication.
- 3. Analyze personal life events using course vocabulary, concepts and theory.
- 4. Demonstrate active listening in sample interviews and observations.
- 5. Work collaboratively through the application of active listening skills and conflict resolution skills.
- 6. Describe, evaluate and demonstrate the components of empathy.
- 7. Differentiate between a person's (self or other) thoughts, feelings, and behaviors.

All courseD2L information and material are posted at the start of the semester, in D2L. Access and upfront chapter notes, pre-audio recordings, videos, assignments, and chapter quizzes provide opportunities for students to be self-paced, as long as all due dates are met (asynchronously online 2 hours weekly). Each student's course participation is tracked in D2L. Students' accessing all course material in D2Lsupports their meeting the course learning outcomes. Additionally, there are weekly collaborate Thursday seminars. Virtual online seminars provide a presence to elaborate and discuss course material. Students join collaborate on Thursdays, add to lecture notes, interact in break out rooms, and then, link to D2L to write weekly 10 minutes quizzes.

**Course minimum required time**: Asynchronously for all course materials. Synchronously in Collaborate join session on Thursdays starting at 2:30=A, 3:30=B, and 3:30=C for 35 minutes. Come to the session prepared: read chapter and full lecture notes and listened to audio and video recordings. Following collaborate seminar, move into D2L in Tool menu and write and submit a chapter quiz (15 minutes).

**Instructor Availability**: Please see fall instructor schedule. Email or and arrange to meet in collaborate. During this remote educational delivery, offering flexibility and accommodation is primary. This is an evolving process that requires strong and ongoing communication with the instructor, along with the best study practices. ## 4. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

# 5. Attendance, Transcript Analysis Questions, Assignment 10 Reflections, Quizzes, Discussion Posts, and Final Examination date TBA: December 14-22.

#### A. Attendance:

Students registered and waitlisted will receive an email one week prior to the start of class. Be sure to reply to this email confirming your interest in this course. If you're registered your seat will be reserved and if you're waitlisted, your name will remain on list until a seat becomes available. No email reply by September 10th means the opportunity to register for the course is lost.

**B.** Transcript Analysis Questions in (d2L) a transcript of a dyad listener and speaker is provided. The listener demonstrates skills and roadblocks and students are to analysis these by completing a series of questions. These questions are set up as a quiz and students write in quizzes on Thursday, December 03, worth 10% of course.

**C. Ten Reflections including ten videos in MindTap and ten reflection activities in D2L**. MindTap: to register for this electronic student resource: <u>https://login.nelsonbrain.com/course/MTPN-GBCN-760F</u>. Students' view the video in MindTap and then complete a reflection activity on the same video in D2L. Video viewings and reflection activities are due prior to the writing of chapter quizzes. **Due: Thursdays at 2:00pm**. Videos are on the skills covered in textbook chapters 3-10. Each of the 10 reflections are worth 2% for a **total of 20% of course**.

**D. Weekly Quizzes:** There are weekly chapter quizzes that comprise 10 multiple choice and 10 true and false questions. The purpose is to ensure the student keeps up with the reading text material. There are NO makeup quizzes. **Quizzes are scheduled the last 15 minutes of seminar:** A=3:05pm, B=4:05pm and C=5:05pm. During quizzes if there are any technical difficulties either email: <u>lenihan@camosun.bc.ca</u> or we can meet in collaborate. The best scores on nine of ten quizzes **comprise 36% of course=4% each quiz.** 

**E. Discussion Posts**: There are four discussion forums. Students are responsible for responding to one of the topics in each forum. Students are expected to provide a post and then a respond to a fellow student's response for each of the four forums. A marking rubric is included to guide students' responses and evaluations. There are four forums, each worth 4%. **Total worth 16% of course.** 

#### **E. Final Examination:**

There is a final examination on chapters one through ten. This exam comprises multiply choice questions, similar to questions on the weekly chapter quizzes. Online final exam will be set up 15 minutes ahead of schedule, in order to login on D2L and ensure all devices are working and connected to WIFI. Email me any of your questions or technical difficulties during the writing of the final examination or we can meet in collaborate. Final exam date is **during scheduled examination week, December 14-22, and it is worth 18%.**

Temporary Grade	Description
