

Special Interest Discussions: The last section will contain	
special interest articles on a number of subjects, ranging	
in topic from mental health to relationships, to cultural	
perspectives on grieving. You'll be asked to read any	
two of these that you find personally interesting and to	
contribute some observations and questions that came	
up for you while you were reading, as well as	
information on one additional research source that	12%
covers this topic. These will be submitted to an online	
group discussion. Each of these contributions will be	
worth 6%, for a total of 12% from special interest
