2. Intended Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will:

- 1. Be able to read and write two sets of Japanese phonetic alphabets, Hiragana and Katakana.
- 2. Learn about 40 Kanji and 350 words.
- 3. Be able to introduce himself/herself, describe locations of things, etc., in basic Japanese.

3. Required Materials

- (a) Texts: An Integrated Course in Elementary Japanese, Genki I, The Japan Times, 3rd ed.
- (b) Other An Integrated Course in Elementary Japanese, Genki I, Workbook I, The Japan Times, 3rd ed.
- (c) Strong internet connection for the Tuesday classes and to view/download media

4. Course Contents and Schedule

JAPN 100 is designed for students who have no previous knowledge of the Japanese language and aims at balanced development of the four language skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing. Upon acquiring the fundamental sentence structures, expressions and vocabulary items, students can comprehend and carry on a basic conversation in Japanese within limited contexts. JAPN 100 covers Genki I, Lesson 1-4.

This course is university transferrable to other institutions. If you choose to continue with Japanese 101 at Camosun in the future for example, that is equivalent to PAAS 138 at the University of Victoria. (JAPN 100+101= PAAS 138).

Assignments

There are four assignments. The assignments are given from the Genki Workbook. These must be completed **Individually.** Work that is copied, done by on-line translation program, etc. will receive 0%. **1% per day will** be deducted for a late submission. (3% each)

Quizzes

There are 5 quizzes.

Quiz 1: Hiragana recognition on D2L (4%)

Quiz 2: mini quiz on Lesson 1, taken on D2L during the specific time frame. (5%)

Quiz 3: Quiz on Lesson 1/2, taken during the online class. (8%)

Quiz 4: mini quiz on Lesson 3, taken on D2L during the specific time frame. (5%)

Quiz 5: Quiz on Lesson 3/4, taken during the online class. (8%)

Review sheets submission

Throughout the course, you are required to view PPT videos to study each concept. After you view the PPTs, you must complete the PDF review sheets and upload them on D2L before the start of the online class to receive any marks. The instructor will inform you on D2L which PDF review sheets to be completed by each online class. Your work will be evaluated for completeness, carefulness, and whether or not you submitted the work by the due. Worth 12% all together.

Tasks

- 1) Self Introduction: a) Students will hand-write a self-introduction paragraph using the structures specified in Class. Your work will be corrected by the instructor. 3%. b) After the correction, the students will type their Introduction paragraphs to publish. 3%. c) the students will add more information to the self-intro, practice
 - speaking and make a video to submit. 7%. The details will be discussed in class.
- 2) Writing on a given topic. 8%. The details will be discussed in class.

Oral Interview

During the last week of the class, each student will have a one-on-one interview with the instructor. Detailed instructions will be given later. 15%.

Attendance

This course is a combination of synchronous learning (online sessions in real time) and asynchronous learning (assigned work you do on your own = self-study). You must attend all weekly synchronous classes for your section (CANADA PT). You will be graded on your attendance, participation and preparedness for these sessions. Links to your recurring weekly sessions will be provided in D2L. Make a note in your calendar that you must be online and present for your synchronous sessions. 10% (1% will be deducted for each absence).

IMPORTANT NOTES

<u>Missed Quizzes:</u> Quizzes must be taken at the scheduled time (CANADA PT). There will be no "make-up" chances. Exceptions are granted for only serious illness or other extenuating circumstances (e.g. accidents, Family affliction etc). In the case of such emergency, please <u>inform your instructor as soon as possible</u>.

<u>SELF-STUDY before and after the class</u>: You are required to view the PPT videos and complete PDF review sheets on D2L. The detailed weekly schedule on what should be completed before and after each synchronous session will be posted. This will prepare you to put your new skills to use when we meet in real-

time. You also need to do the textbook and workbook exercises on your own. Please expect to spend minimum 5-7 hours for Self-Study per week.

<u>D2L</u>: Learn to use D2L, the online teaching and learning platform used at Camosun. You can access student tutorials <u>here</u>. It is your responsibility to check D2L regularly for updates, assignments, how to prepare for the online synchronous sessions, materials, etc. Please set up D2L to send a notification via email each time something is posted or updated in the class D2L site.
