COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course examines the health, safety and nutritional needs of children. Emphasis is placed on the role and responsibilities of the educator in establishing and maintaining safe, nurturing environments for children in cooperation with families. Students learn how to create health, safety and nutrition curriculum and policies.

Learning Outcomes:

1. Explain diverse attitudes, knowledge and cultural variations related to health, safety and nutrition.

Explore personal attitudes, knowledge and cultural variations in regards to regulated standards

2. Identify the role of the practitioner in maintaining healthy and safe environments.

Provide examples of communicating health, safety and nutritional information with respect to the primary role of the family

3. Apply principles of health and wellness promotion to personal and professional practice.

ASSIGNMENT POLICY

Should students receive a mark of less than 50% on an assignment, they may request to re-write and re-submit the assignment. Permission to resubmit an assignment is at the discretion of the instructor, re-written assignments can receive a maximum grade of C+ (65%).
