HCA 173: CLINICAL PLACEMENT 2

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This practice course provides an opportunity to apply the caring philosophy with older adults needing complex care. Select supervised experiences will emphasize the application and integration of knowledge and skills learned in all other courses. Residents who require moderate to total assistance with activities of daily living will be selected for student assignment.

The final transitional practice experience provides an opportunity for the learner to become better prepared to take on the role of the Health Care Assistant. Opportunities will be provided for the learner to gain increased self-confidence in the work setting and to become socialized into the work role.

TOTAL CLINICAL HOURS: 125 hours

PRE-REQUISITE: All academic courses plus HCA 172
