Description:

Policies

- Classroom Content Applications (CCA) will not be granted a grade if absent from the class in which is due, but it still must be completed to demonstrate the learning outcomes.
- If you anticipate handing in any of the following assignments late (Presentation Reports
 Assignment and the Holistic Health & Healing Research Paper Assignment) and have
 notified the instructor before the due date, 5% per day will be deducted. If the instructor
 is <u>not</u> consulted before the due date then the assignment will be deducted 10% per day.
 No assignment listed above will be accepted after one calendar week after the due date
 resulting in not receiving a grade for the course.
- All assignments <u>must</u> be completed to a minimum of a "C" grade in order to receive a final letter grade for the course.
- If an absence is due to illness, the assignment must be emailed to the instructor by the start time of the class to demonstrate completion of the assignment, and a doctor's note will be required. A hard copy will need to be handed in upon returning to class.
- In exceptional circumstances, students may arrange with the instructor for an extension of an assignment before the due date. A professional's note will be required.
