5. Basis of Student Assessment (Weighting)

(a) Labs (20% of grade)

You must complete all labs to pass the course. You must achieve a minimum average of 55% on the labs.

You can hand in Labs up to 1 week late from their due date/time at a 50% penalty. After 1 week late, you will be graded a zero but MUST STILL COMPLETE ALL LABS TO PASS THE COURSE. Exceptions will ONLY be given for dire and documented short-term medical or family emergencies (c) Term Tests (30% of grade)

(d) Final Exam (50% of grade)

15% is Written Exam, 35% is Practical Exam. *Due to COVID19, the written exam will be an at-home, open-book timed exam in D2L. The practical exam will be a time-limited coding project.* **You must achieve a combined minimum average of 55% on the Final Exam to pass the course.**

B. Temporary Grades

Temporary grades are assigned for specific circumstances and will convert to a final grade according to the grading scheme being used in the course. Temporary Grade	Description
Ι	<i>Incomplete</i> : A temporary grade assigned when the requirements of a course have not yet been completed due to hardship or extenuating circumstances, such as illness or death in the family.
IP	<i>In progress</i> : A temporary grade assigned for courses that are designed to have an anticipated enrollment that extends beyond one term. No more than two IP grades will be assigned for the same course.
CW	<i>Compulsory Withdrawal</i> : A temporary grade assigned by a Dean when an instructor, after documenting the prescriptive strategies applied and consulting with peers, deems that a student is unsafe to self or others and must be removed from the lab, practicum, worksite, or field placement.
