## **CALENDAR DESCRIPTION**

Students will be introduced to fundamentals of electricity, magnetism, mechanics, and heat as they relate to electric machines and transformers. Students will apply these principles to the study of DC motors and generators, single and polyphase motors, alternators, and systems. Students will be able to select suitable system components, use appropriate instrumentation and apply appropriate safety procedures to implement various scenarios in a lab environment.

#### COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

- 1. Describe the various methods of AC and DC generation.
- 2. Discuss typical polyphase connections of transformers in a three-phase power system.
- 3. Explain the methods used to develop torque in single and polyphase motors.
- 4. Construct and analyze motor control circuits in both AC and DC.
- 5. Calculate circuit parameters for the motor, generator, and transformer circuits.
- 6. Select and use appropriate test equipment to measure and verify correct operation of motors, generators, and transformers.
- 7. Use complex numbers and vector diagrams to calculate circuit parameters.
- 8. Use appropriate diagnostic procedures to troubleshoot faulty circuits.
- 9. Select the appropriate machine for a given task.
